Thank you for your interest in becoming a member of Sandy Beach Club.

Membership details and fees for our various membership categories, as well as additional fees for boat storage and personal storage, are detailed on the reverse side of this letter. Please complete the application, review the club rules, and return the signed application with a check in the amount of your total membership fee, payable to **Sandy Beach Club**. All returned checks will result in a \$25.00 fee. Please note that lockers and boat storage locations are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis.

All members (for all membership categories) are required to have a Club ID with photo on file. Please email a recent family photo (including all family members with membership privileges) when you mail your application. This photo will be used by club staff for identification purposes only. Please send your completed application, emailed photo, and check. Please include ALL information on your application, including signatures of ALL adults, birthdates of all children, all vehicle information (make, model, color and license plate number), full boat description (make, model, dimensions, detailed description, and registration number, if applicable) and emailed photo of all family members who will have membership privileges. Please be sure to provide us with accurate watercraft dimensions so we may assign a suitable storage accommodation.

Important Dates

April 4th: Opening Day of Boating Season. The boat launch will be open daily through November 8th.

May 23rd: Opening Day for Beach Area. The beach area will be open daily through Labor Day.

July 4th: 4th of July Holiday!! Club will remain open for Quassy's fireworks (usually begin at 10:15pm).

Sept 7th: Labor Day. Closing Day for Beach Area. This is the last day to use the beach area.

October 25th: Last Day for Boat Club/Combo Water Slip Docking. (Boats must be removed by this date.)

November 8th: Closing Day of Boat Launch. This is the last day for boat launching.

Availability: Stand-alone or as part of a Combination Membership

Pricing: Singles, couples, and families, as well as discounted prices for seniors

Boat Launch: May be used to bring watercraft in for seasonal storage; no daily launching permitted

Watercraft Storage: Fee-based (racks \$170, water slips \$695/\$865)

Storage Accommodations: Fee-based (lockers \$100)

Dates: May 23, 2026 through September 7, 2026

Club Hours: Vary (see chart below)

Guest Fees: Adults (ages 15 & up) \$15.00; Children (ages 14 & under) \$10.00; **Holiday guest fees vary.**

Please note that non-members may only visit the club as guests five times per season.

Amenities: Swimming, boating, picnic area, basketball court, fishing from designated fishing dock

Availability: Stand-alone or as part of a Combination Membership

Pricing: One fee for individual, couples, families or seniors

Boat Launch: Daily use from April 4, 2026 through November 8, 2026

Watercraft Storage: Fee-based (racks \$170, water slips \$695/\$865)

Storage Accommodations: Fee based (lockers \$100)

Dates: April 4, 2026 through November 8, 2026

Hours: Daily 6:00am to dusk (15 minutes prior to sunset)

Guests Fees: No charge; no limit to how often a guest may accompany member on boat

Amenities: On-site daily trailer parking; boat launch only (no use of any other beach club amenities)

Combination Membership

Availability: This is a combined Beach and Boat Membership.

Pricing: Singles, couples, and families, as well as discounted prices for seniors.

Boat Launch: May be used daily from April 4, 2026 through November 8, 2026

Watercraft Storage: Fee-based (racks \$170, water slips \$695/\$865)

Storage Accommodations: Fee based (lockers \$100)

Dates: April 4, 2026 through November 8, 2026 for boat launch; May 23, 2026 through September 7, 2026 for beach club

Hours: Daily 6:00am to dusk (15 min. prior to sunset) for boat launch; beach hours vary (see chart)

Guests: If only going for a boat ride, guests are allowed for free and there is no limit to how often a guest may visit. If swimming, picnicking or using any beach club facilities, guests may visit for a fee; Adults (ages 15 & up) \$15.00; Children (ages 14 & under) \$10.00); **Holiday guest fees vary.** Please note that non-members may only visit the club as guests five times per season.

Amenities: Includes all Beach Membership and Boat Membership amenities.

Notes

* The club facilities may be rented for parties and events by **all** club members.

* **All** club members may purchase items from snack bar.

* **All** club members are required to have a Club ID with photo on file.



Beach Membership Rules

- Upon entering the club, members should check-in with a staff member at the main entrance.
- Guests must be signed in and paid for prior to or upon arrival.
- Guests will not be admitted without a member present.
- Members are responsible for conveying club rules to their guests.
- On bad days -i.e.- cloudy, rainy, dark, threatening, etc., we will not be open. If the weather turns bad during club hours, we reserve the right to close early. The beach will be cleared at first sound of thunder and will remain closed for 30 minutes after the last clap of thunder is heard. Covered areas are not to be used as storm shelters. Members may wait out minor storms in their vehicles.
- Children are not allowed to play on the boat docks. Shoes are required in the designated fishing and boating areas of the club.
- Fishing is allowed (with adult supervision) in the designated area on the blue docks only.
- Roller skates, in-line skates and skateboards are not allowed on club property.
- **Pets are not allowed on club property or in boats at any time.**
- The pavilion, the bathrooms, the boat docks, and the picnic area are not areas for children to play.
- Running and horseplay are not allowed on the beach, docks, or rafts.
- Alcohol Abuse is prohibited. Anyone who appears intoxicated will be removed from club property.
- Anyone who refuses to obey the club rules will be asked to leave the club.
- Please notify the club ahead of time when bringing 8 or more guests. This will facilitate appropriate staffing.
- Large groups of guests/parties will not be permitted during the last two weeks of the season.
- Lost and found articles may be claimed / turned in at the main entrance.
- Minors must be accompanied by an adult.

Water Rules

- No boats, floats, tubes, or kickboards of any kind are permitted on or near the swim rafts.
- Swimmers with floats, tubes, kickboards, etc. should not be over their heads.
- The left corner swim raft is a quiet raft. No jumping, diving, or splashing is permitted.
- Water wings are permitted in shallow water only.
- Life jackets worn while swimming to the deep-water rafts MUST be kept on. If you cannot swim the distance without a life jacket, you should not take it off when you get there.
- Connecticut law requires that there be a properly fitting life jacket for everyone onboard a vessel at all times, including manually propelled vessels. It also requires that all children less than 13 years of age at any time of the year must wear a properly fitting life jacket at all times. The law also states that life jackets must be worn by everyone between October 1st and May 31st while on a manually propelled vessel.
- Anyone seen breaking the rules at any time will be removed from the water.
- Flips, back dives, or any other type of gymnastics on or from the rafts are prohibited.
- Swimming under the rafts is prohibited.

Lifeguards

- The lifeguards are on duty to assist swimmers in need. Please watch your children carefully.
- The lifeguards are here to enforce the rules and help promote a safer environment. We ask that members please support them in these tasks.
- On occasion, the lifeguards may find it necessary to create new rules that promote patron safety.

Please explain the risks associated with shallow water diving to your children. This can be extremely dangerous as well as life threatening!!!



Boating Membership Rules

- **Please do not disclose the gate combination to anyone!**
- **Boats may be launched beginning at 6:00am per state of Connecticut.**
- **Please respect our neighbors!! Launch your boat quietly.**
- **The club closes promptly at dusk. Please be on shore 15 minutes prior to sunset.** Night fishing is not allowed.
- **Pets are not allowed in boats or on club property at any time.**
- Please be respectful of our limited parking space.
- Members must be present when boat is launched.
- Guests must be accompanied by a member.
- Members are responsible for conveying club rules to their guests.
- Children must always be with a parent.
- Please respect the privacy of property owners on the lake. Please do not trespass on private property.
- When exiting the club, please do not drive through Tyler's Cove.
- Boats docked in water slips should have bilge pumps.
- It is the boat owner's responsibility to check on their boats after storms.
- Please be safe! Stay clear of swimmers and unpowered crafts.
- Please make every effort not to transport aquatic life from other lakes and rivers (i.e. weeds, zebra mussels, etc.). Failure to adhere to these guidelines may result in a Connecticut state fine and loss of membership. Please contact management for further information.
- Please make every effort to release fish unharmed. Here are some tips: Avoid netting and touching the fish. When not jaw hooked, cut line close to mouth while fish remains in the water. When jaw hooked, use needle nosed pliers to remove hook while fish remains in water.
- Please abide by all Coast Guard Rules of Inland Waterways that include: Each person must have an approved personal flotation device, etc.
- Connecticut law requires that there be a properly fitting life jacket for everyone onboard a vessel at all times, including manually propelled vessels. It also requires that all children less than 13 years of age at any time of the year must wear a properly fitting life jacket at all times. The law also states that life jackets must be worn by everyone between October 1st and May 31st while on a manually propelled vessel.
- Please report all violations to the Middlebury Police Department (203-577-4028), the Connecticut DEEP (1-800-842-HELP) and Sandy Beach Club (203-758-8480).
- Please abide by all current Connecticut fishing and boating laws that include:
 - The taking of a maximum of one 18" or larger trout per day.
 - The taking of a maximum of one 18" or larger bass per day.
 - **6 MPH maximum boat speed** at all times.
- Please dispose of trash in proper containers. No littering!
- No swimming or fishing from club property.
- No picnicking on club property.
- Launch may not be used for any kind of hunting.
- Alcohol abuse is prohibited.
- Anyone who refuses to obey the club rules will be asked to leave the club.
- Be courteous and sportsman-like at all times.
- Lost and found articles may be claimed / turned in at the main gate.
- Please inform us if your vehicle or boat registration information changes during the season.
- Please use common sense during storms for your safety and the safety of others.
